COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is an introduction to theoretical and practical piano and keyboard skills. Emphasis is placed on developing repertoire, articulations, sight reading, transposition, harmonization, and consistency of tempo. This course is designed for music majors and all students interested in developing fundamental piano and keyboard skills.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

1. Develop skills in analysis of a simple musical notation, fingerings, easy chords and scales in beginner piano music.
2. Develop skills to perform simple solo and ensemble compositions with finger strength, rhythmic and technical accuracy and dynamic expressions.
3. Develop aural, aesthetic and cultural awareness by performing simple music from different cultures and styles.

STUDENT LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

1. Demonstrate the proper piano hand position and posture.
2. Demonstrate basic piano techniques by playing 5-finger patterns, scale, and chord progression in multiple major keys.
3. Perform simple solo and ensemble piano pieces.
4. Identify the fundamentals of music notation, terms and music theory.
